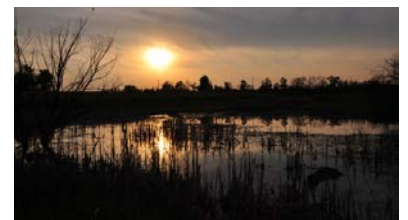
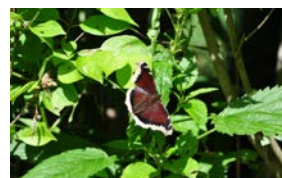
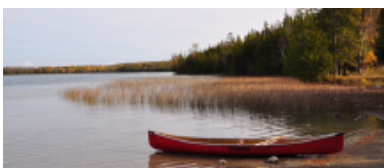


## National Parks of Southern Ontario

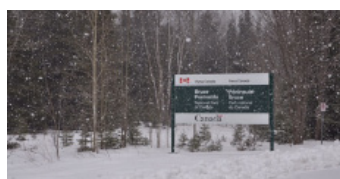

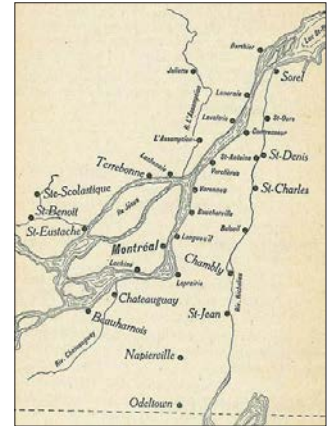
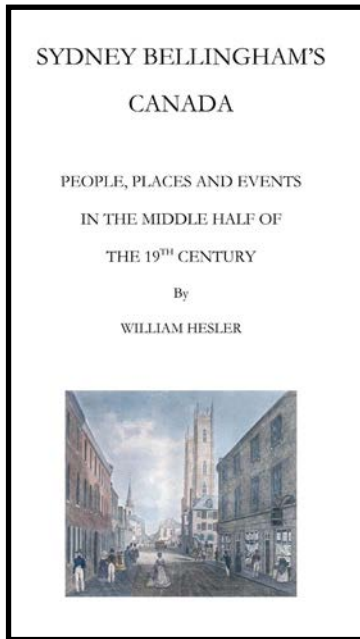

## Sydney Bellingham's Canada People, Places and Events in the Middle Half of the 19th Century William Hesler

Sydney Bellingham came to Canada in 1824 from Ireland, all by himself, at the age of fifteen. He was remarkably independent in thought as well as in deed. At the young age of twenty-nine, he was appointed a magistrate. During the Rebellions of 1837 and 1838, he served as a captain in the Royal Montreal Cavalry, and played a key role in the success of the British forces at the Battle of St. Charles. He brought about the settlement of Arundel Township, including the building of their first railway. Bellingham was on a first-name basis with Sir John A. Macdonald and many of the other political and business notables whose names we still recognize today. He had a great admiration for the people who, back then, called themselves Canadians. His lack of prejudice and snobbery sets him apart from a lot of English-speaking writers of that era, and made him a keen-eyed observer with a fresh perspective on important events in Canadian history.

This is a collection of historical snapshots of the events Sydney Bellingham witnessed and the people he knew.

## Kwädäy Dän Ts'inchj

Teachings from Long Ago Person Found

Richard J. Hebda, Sheila Greer, Alexander Mackie

On a late summer day a young man set out on a voyage through the mountains. In 1999, 300 years later, he was discovered by three hunters on the edge of a glacier in northwestern BC, near the Alaska-Yukon border. His remains, preserved in glacial ice for centuries, offered answers, setting in motion a unique multidisciplinary collaboration between indigenous peoples and the scientific community based on mutual respect.

Through forensic investigation we learn that he was 18 years old, 5' 8" tall, had a tapeworm, a gastric ulcer, and was in the early stages of tuberculosis. From the food sources found in his stomach, colon and rectum, we learned he traveled 70 km in two days. We know he died in August because flowers of the beach asparagus, found in his stomach, only bloom in August, in the area he was found.

The man's name had faded from even the long memory of the local Champagne and Aishihik indigenous peoples so they renamed him, Kwaday Dan Ts'inchj—the Long Ago Person Found.

This comprehensive and collaborative account contains contributors from around the world, interweaving scientific analysis and cultural knowledge to describe not only an individual and his world, but also a model for how diverse ways of knowing, in both scholarly and oral traditions, can complement each other to provide a new understanding of our complex histories.

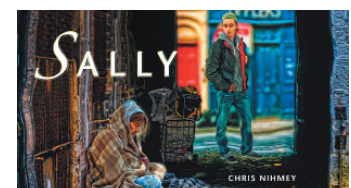


## United Together Reflections Of Our Lives Chris Nihmey

For over a decade, he battled three life-debilitating illnesses and they nearly destroyed him. Knowing the extreme dangers of stigma in society, he made a decision to hide his illnesses. He hid behind writing, and found hope through words. In 2007, he began the writing of his memoir, *Two Sides To The Story: Living A Lie*, and in 2016 he released an illustrated picture book, *Sally*. Through writing and speaking, he aims to further educate society on mental illness, and the dangerous effects that stigma has on both sufferers and their families.

Set in the Wild West during frontier times, *Yipee's Gold Mountain* is told by Yip Yee, an orphaned Chinese ex-railway laborer who hopes to be a cowboy, and Na-tio, an Apache warrior-apprentice who is recovering from his first botched raid. Through alternating chapters both characters reveal different sides of the story, as their mutual suspicion turns to friendship. Together, Na-tio and the tiny, determined Yip Yee face down a wolf attack, a sinister bounty hunter and greater challenges still, in this hard scrabble world of fortune-seekers, soldiers and warriors. Through all this, Na-tio must cope with a terrible crisis for his people, and Yip Yee is guarding a big secret (she's a girl).

Driven by a fast-paced plot, delivered in deceptively simple language, *Yipee's Gold Mountain* addresses themes of inter-cultural confusion, conflict, and cooperation. Books, periodicals, and a research trip to Arizona provided the basis for the story. An author's note discusses historic background and setting, and offers a partial list of sources as well as acknowledgements.
